**PHAROS**

Mona is an excavation of the underside of human nature. And now we've built an extension to the museum, called Pharos, to round out the metaphor. A crack of light... And a nice spot to sit down, because people are always complaining there aren't enough chairs in the museum.

Pharos houses major works by James Turrell, Jean Tinguely, Charles Ross, Richard Wilson, and Randy Polumbo. There's also a bar and restaurant, called Faro, where you can eat, drink and enjoy the view of the Derwent, until late into the night.

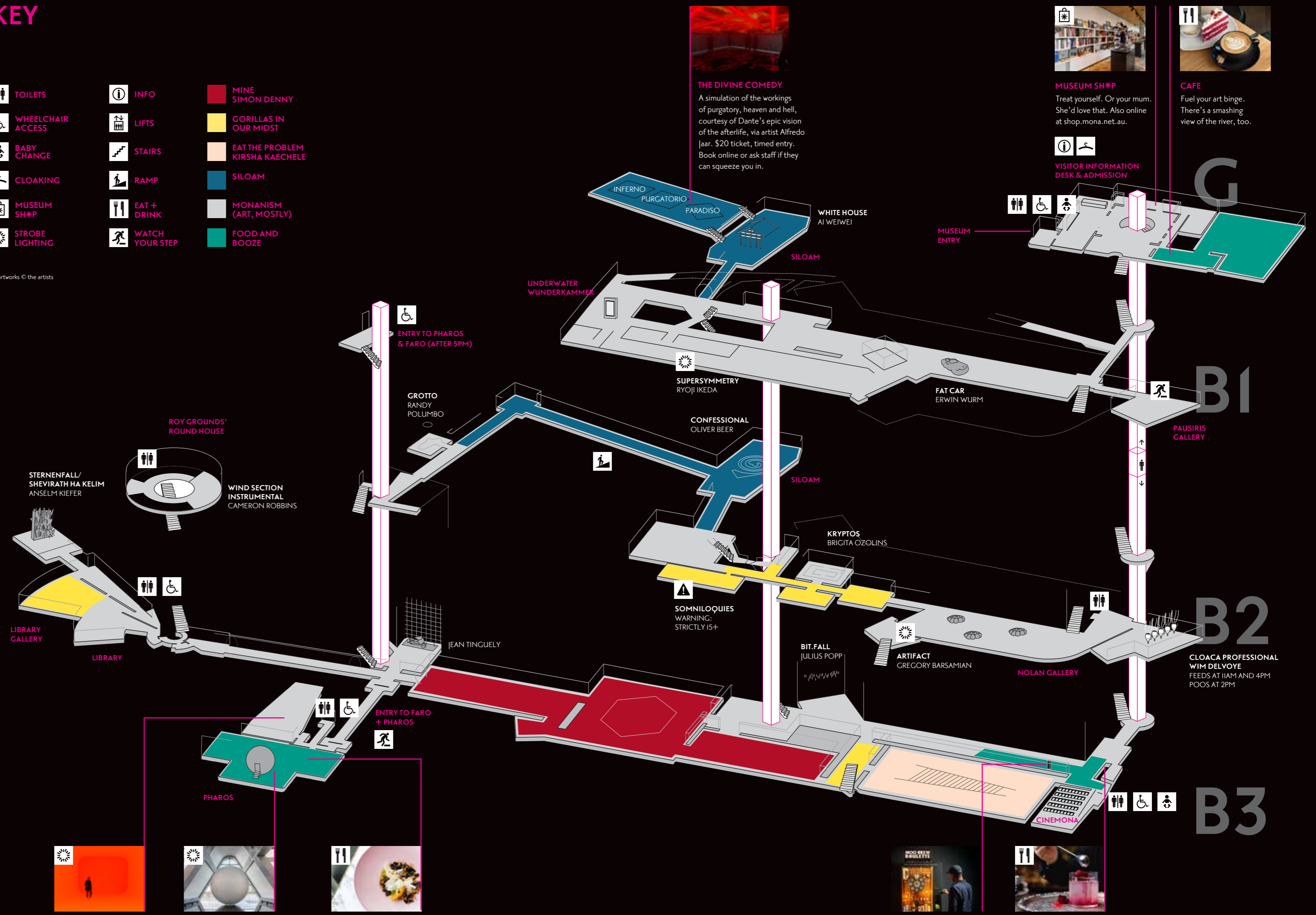
**EAT THE PROBLEM**

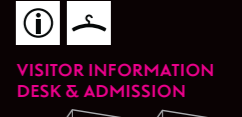
**THE DIVINE COMEDY**
